Kristine Hatanaka, the Artistic Director for AVPA's art program is delighted that the Academy students have the opportunity to exhibit their work at so many venues throughout the community. According to Hatanaka, "Opportunities seem to be popping up everywhere. The exhibition with the art students from WLAC is a new venture for the high school.
